

# What is Fratton Big Local?

Fratton Big Local is a Big Lottery funded 10-year project. It was launched in 2013 and aims to make lasting improvements to Fratton. It is run by a Partnership of local residents, who make decisions about how to spend the funding. This booklet tells you about the eighth year of Fratton Big Local's work in Fratton, and how plans have developed since you were last consulted.

# What is in the Fratton Big Local Plan?

Our Local plan is set in the context of National Big Local Outcomes: Communities will be better able to identify local needs and take action in response to them. People will have increased skills and confidence, so that they continue to identify and respond to needs in the future. The community make a difference to the needs it prioritizes. People will feel that their area is an even better place to live in.

# Message from Fr. Bob, Chair of Fratton Big Local

It seems a long time ago that there was a small group in the Hall at St Mary's at which we were told that as a community we had been awarded £1million pounds of National Lottery Funds as part of Big Local. We were to be one of the first 'trial' areas and no-one quite knew what lay ahead!

Over the last 10 years we have had many moments of fun and celebration as well as some days and times of struggle and frustration. The last year which this 'Fratton Delivers' looks at has both of those experiences – the fun and celebration of some of our events – the Jubilee picnic; the return of the May Fayre; the visit of the Moon and the 20,000 that came to visit it ... I wonder what would be your favourite moment of 2022? But there have also been the struggles as we continue to move out of COVID and the impact on our lives and the financial situation we face. Our hopes to open a Pantry in the community have been delayed as we still wait for a potential space to host to become available.

But over the 10 years there has been a constant which is the energy and enthusiasm of many local people to work with us to make Fratton a better place to live, work and play. There is a strong sense of community and this is reflected in groups and agencies that work here, as well as by local residents. Perhaps one of the most important moments of the year is when we stop and recognise the countless volunteers who give of their time and skills to support the common life of Fratton.

We are now entering the final years of Fratton Big Local's funding and the partners are working with others to ensure that there is a legacy which will enable many of our events and celebrations to continue into the future and become a regular part of our shared life. We will seek to keep you informed of what is being considered and planned as well as continue to work with others to host events such as the May Fayre, Community Picnics, Family Festival and Lantern parade.

Lastly, Fratton Big Local can only deliver what it does because of the dedication, commitment and enthusiasm of our small staff team – so thank you to Anna and Monique (and to Kay who supports them) for all you have done over the past years.

As Chair I look forward to the year that lies ahead and to discover where the FBL journey will take us next!















# How many other Big Locals are there?

There are 150 other Big Locals across England – the nearest to Fratton is on Wecock Farm in Waterlooville. The Big Lottery funding for all the Big Locals is managed by a national organization called Local Trust, which was set up for this purpose.

Local Trust send a representative to Fratton Big Local Partnership meetings.

# **Who runs Fratton Big Local?**

Decisions are made by the Fratton Big Local Partnership, which is made up of voting members and non-voting members.

Voting members 51% of which have to live, work or play in Fratton.

Non-voting members are people who have skills that could be useful to the Partnership, or work for organizations that provide services to Fratton. A non-voting place is reserved for a local City Councillor. There have to be between 8 and 12 voting members, so up to 7 need to live, work or play in Fratton.

## How can I get involved?

**Volunteering -** We're always looking for volunteers to help our projects reach as many people as possible. It makes FBL's work more effective and can be an opportunity to meet new people or gain new skills. Over 100 volunteered with FBL last year.

**Fratton Federation -** Bi-monthly meeting where people who run organizations or provide services in Fratton meet to share information and ideas. Over 80 people from over 70 organization took part last year.

**Fratton Traders Association –** A group to enable Traders in Fratton Road to share challenges, ideas and opportunities. They support the Fratton Family Festival and other events and are involved in consultations about developments and changes in Fratton Road.

**Friends of Kingston Rec** – Help to ensure that the transformed Kingston Rec continues to be safe and clean. They also organize additional play activities and other events including the Family Festive Fox Trail and help the elves install Santa's post box.

#### **Fratton CAN!**

The FBL Partnership wants to continue working closely with the community, volunteers, local businesses and partner organizations to make the most positive impact it can in the remaining year of the project. We are exploring ways we might leave a legacy behind us when the project ends. It's an ongoing conversation, so please get in touch with FBL and give us your views.

# What did we do in 2022?

#### MARCH -APRIL X Y

Fratton Big Local has a Community Grants Scheme which fund local groups or organisations and helps to bring new activities to Fratton. In the past we have

helped The Repair Café, The Good Mental Health Co-op and many more. FBL subsidised the room rent for the Chop, Cook and Chat group to encourage men to cook and eat more healthily.

At last one of the big annual events in Fratton was back The May Fayre. FBL's contribution to the day was to organise activity inside the church. Stalls for local groups and organisations where you could find out about local creatives like Wild City Portsmouth and Trash Arts, environmental projects like the university's Revolution Plastics or health groups such as Breatheasy.

Always a busy event where 10,000 people attend during the day this year it was more like 15.000.

# The 5th year of The Inspiring Fratton Awards

The Inspiring Fratton Awards were set up in 2019 by **Fratton Big Local** and **Stephen Morgan MP** to celebrate people and their achievement in the Fratton Big Local area.

Each category is open to individuals regardless of their age. The important thing is their actions benefit the Fratton Community.

More than one award may be given in a particular category if judges feel it is appropriate.

So if you know someone from Fratton who is a wonderful dancer, an amazing runner, an inspiring teacher or a great volunteer you can nominate them using this form or online using the QR code.

To nominate someone, you will need to have their permission or their parent or carer if they are under 18 years of age. You may also be contacted about your nomination. The judges will be using what you have written about your nominee to make their decisions so think carefully about what you write.

You can only make one nomination in each category and only nominate once. Duplicate forms will be discounted.

The Awards are decided by a panel and will be based on what is written about any one nominee not necessarily on the number of times the same person or organisation is nominated.

More than one award may be given in a particular category if judges feel it is appropriate.

Individuals and organisation who have not been nominated or received an award in previous years are particularly welcome.
